RECONCILING COMMITTEE



Fairview UMC....You have done it again! You always go above and beyond when it comes to the kids in our church and community. These are the tallies from the School Supplies that we collected. 10 Backpacks, 502 Colored pencils, 6 Composition notebooks, 944 crayons, 29 Dry erasers, 9 Erasers, 3770 Sheets of filing paper,

26 Folders, 23 Glue sticks, 1 Bottle Hand Sanitizer, 33 Highlighters, 26 Markers, 390 Pencils, 9 Pencil boxes, 3 Pencil pouches, 1 Pencil sharpener, 60 Pens, 28 Post its, 2 Scissors, 136 One subject notebooks, 1 Box of tissues, 3 Containers disinfectant wipes 75 sheets, 12 Containers disinfectant wipes 225 sheets. WOW!

Food Pantry numbers continue to increase weekly. And with this happening more grant money is being shared with us. We are celebrating our 5th Anniversary September 17 of cooking Community Meals. We are giving out diapers to over 35 families per month. Yarn is available to anyone interested in knitting hats, scarves, gloves and mittens for our Clothesline going up in December. 
WHAT'S NEW IN THE UPPER NEW YORK CONFERENCE

WELCOME FALL!

When the Frost is on the Punkin BY JAMES WHITCOMB RILEY

The husky, rusty russel of the tossels of the corn,
And the raspin' of the tangled leaves, as golden as the morn;
The stubble in the furries—kindo' lonesome-like, but still
A-preachin' sermuns to us of the barns they growed to fill;
The strawstack in the medder, and the reaper in the shed;
The hosses in theyr stalls below—the clover over-head!—
O, it sets my hart a-clickin' like the tickin' of a clock,
When the frost is on the punkin and the fodder's in the shock!

Then your apples all is gethered, and the ones a feller keeps Is poured around the celler-floor in red and yeller heaps; And your cider-makin' 's over, and your wimmern-folks is through With their mince and apple-butter, and theyr souse and saussage, too! ... I don't know how to tell it—but ef sich a thing could be As the Angels wantin' boardin', and they'd call around on me—I'd want to 'commodate 'em—all the whole-indurin' flock—When the frost is on the punkin and the fodder's in the shock!

James Whitcomb Riley was born in Indiana in 1849. While the revered poets of New England held sway in the late 19 th century, it was Riley, with his folksy mid-American voice and child-like spelling that set his works apart from those New Englanders. I love the last lines that once all the work is done, if the Angels wanted shelter, we would offer Christian hospitality.

The fall season finds me drawn to the music of the early 19 th century and the American composers of that era. Two, in particular, are a good fit. "Jesus Spreads His Banner O'er Us" by Francis H Barthelemon, a Connecticut pastor, has the hymn tune Autumn. The "banner" represents the cloth Jesus spreads over his followers as they gather at the Communion table.

Fantasia on WEBB was written by George James Webb. In 1830 Webb emigrated to Boston, Massachusetts where he became the organist at the Old South Church for 40 years. We know this song as "Stand Up, Stand Up, for Jesus". While many today consider this an old-fashioned song, its origins come from a sermon Webb preached that many of the day considered his best and most influential message.

Musically all aspects of our worship will continue to offer the old, traditional hymns along with more modern songs as we strive for the most meaningful worship experience for all who worship with us.

As always, we encourage anyone interested in singing in the choir or ringing with the handbells to jump in, we need you.
